League News

Storm Doris had a major impact on a couple of Midland Football League clubs last week. Division 3 leaders NKF Burbage suffered damage at their Kirkby Road ground which they share with Barwell FC. A building behind one of the stands had its roof blown off, up and over the stand and onto the pitch leaving smashed light bulbs on the pitch and wood and nails everywhere. The tea/food stall has also lost its roof leaving just the four walls standing. Not surprisingly, their top of the table clash with Northfield Town had to be postponed.



Knowle FC suffered devastation when the roof of their club house was blown off and onto Knowle Cricket Club. The storm hit while a Half Term coaching camp was taking place with 35 youngsters in attendance.

The local community has rallied around Knowle FC after storm Doris destroys club house.

Knowle FC is gradually coming to terms with the shock of the roof being blown off their clubhouse in Storm Doris and the resulting closing of the ground for the foreseeable future. However, in true Corinthian spirit the club and its teams are responding to the challenge and, as befits an FA Community club with 25 adult and children's sides, male and female, the club are receiving support from the wider community, including the business community.

National League, Solihull Moors FC, in an act of great generosity have agreed to Knowle first team playing its next two Midland Football League fixtures at their stadium, The Automated Technology Stadium, Solihull, free of charge. Knowle are hoping to arrange a legends' game and will be approaching friends at Aston Villa and Birmingham City in this regard.

Arden school has also allowed the junior teams the chance to continue playing their matches on their school field also free of charge, an offer that was gratefully received this weekend.

All this goes to show the great community spirit in the Knowle area and the affection people have for the club.

Everyone at the club would like to say a huge thank you for help given so far and all the support yet to come.

The club have sent up a crowd funding website in an attempt to raise the much-needed funds to get the club back on track.

Over 250 guests and well-wishers joined former players to pay tribute to Tony Alden on the 50th anniversary of the tragedy that claimed his life.

An emotional crowd gathered ahead of The Gates league match v Long Eaton on Saturday to pay tribute to Tony Alden on the 50th anniversary of his tragic death, after he was fatally struck by lightning whilst playing for Highgate v Enfield in 1967.

They watched in silence as Tony's widow Sue and sister Christine unveiled the newly named '**The Tony Alden Stand**' before breaking into applause.

This was followed by current captain Josh Hawker laying a large wreath in the club colours, the small card reading "**Remembering Tony Alden, never to be forgotten, from all at Highgate United Past & Present**" the Highgate wreath was then joined by one in Red, White and Blue laid by Roger Green on behalf of Enfield Town. Roger and two other friends had made the journey from Enfield to The Coppice as they did exactly 50 years ago, to the day to pay tribute, in what I can only describe as a truly remarkable act, one that deservedly earned many plaudits from everyone associated with Highgate. And we have now found ourselves 3 new honorary friends.

Following the laying of the wreaths, the crowd impeccably observed a minute's silence, just the distant sound of birdsong provoking deep and meaningful thoughts amongst those present.

Guests were then invited back to the clubhouse for food and drinks, as songs of the 60's quietly played in the background.

Top of the guest list with Sue and Christine were the former team mates of Tony, including goalkeeper Tony Sawyer, Tony Hughes, Hughie Doherty, Roy Taylor, Trevor Jones, Gordon Cooper and Eric Taylor. Also present was Tony's best man and best friend Graham Parkes who recently came over from Spain.

We were also honoured to welcome Andy Walker on behalf of the FA, who was joined by fellow top officials Kevin Shoemake and Steve Poole from Birmingham County FA, Colin Waldron from Worcestershire County FA and Nigel Wood from The Midland Football League.

Also in attendance was BBC's Ian Winter, who having filmed Eric & Roy Taylor with Ken Barnett for a feature on BBC Midlands Today (shown Friday 24/02/17 BBC1 at 6.30pm) felt the need to attend on a personal note. The event had great coverage from the BBC, together with the tea time TV feature on BBC1, Friday morning we were featured on Adrian Goldberg's breakfast show on BBC WM. Special thanks to Steve Hermon of the BBC for helping us out.

On the subject of thanks, I need to thank many, many people – as usual we're indebted to Chris Hughes, without whom this event wouldn't have been possible. Thank you to JLN Group and Connor Signs for their support with the new stand sign. Paul Broadhurst for the supply of the curtains and Vi Stevens Florists for the beautiful wreath.

Despite the reason of the reunion of the 1967 side being a tragic event, it was great to see them and Tony's family, reminiscing tales of happier times. There were no doubt a few glasses raised to the memory of Tony Alden along with the memories of Tony Murphy, Tony Law, Trevor Quiggin and Micky Keeley.

Many people are now looking forward to the forthcoming book, funds are still being raised towards its publication via crowdfunder (see [here](#)) and is expected to be completed by the end of May.

Marshall joined our Academy this season and has already been out on trial at Blues and Scunthorpe. Moreover having played Grimsby recently he was immediately invited to trial with them too but sees his immediate future with Solihull.

Tyrese Shade is also 16 and Birmingham born. At 6 foot tall, he plays wide on either flank or in any attacking position. Highly athletic and skilful, he will go a long way as he matures. Tyrese spent 9 years with Blues Academy and was released at 15 years old. Like Marshall, he was outstanding recently against Grimsby and they offered to take him on trial. Again he sees his immediate future here with us.

Another Birmingham born 6 footer is Reiss McNally. Reiss is a defender in the Michael Nottingham mold, and is the youngest player at our Academy not reaching 17 until August. He joined Academy Moors this year and has attracted interest from Blues and more recently Grimsby where he particularly impressed their Academy manager Neil Woods. He was previously at Coventry City and Wolves as a schoolboy.

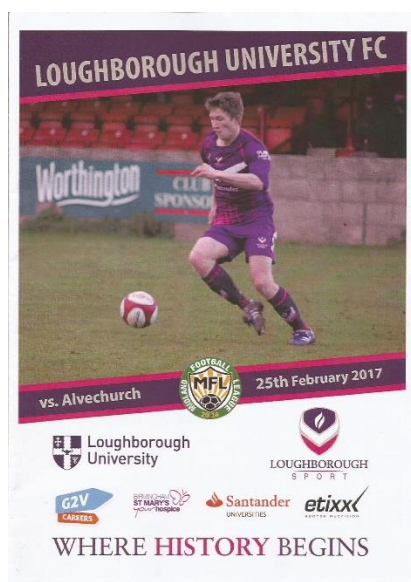
Premier Division (54)

Loughborough University 0 Alvechurch 2

Time to watch the Premier Division leaders at the superbly appointed University Stadium. In the corresponding fixture last season, the Scholar shocked Alvechurch with a superb display and a deserved victory. Could we be in for a repeat? Both sides had to cope with a gusty win which was going to make things difficult. In the 3rd minute, Connor Deards reached the Loughborough goalline and his cross was well held by Conor O'Keefe. Babucar Souane was finding space on the left for Alvechurch and an excellent cross from the left-back failed to find an attacker. In the 10th minute, Josh March was tripped on the edge of the penalty area. Souane took the free-kick and shot into the side-netting. Alvechurch took the lead in the 17th minute. Deards played the ball out to the right wing to Ryan Edmunds who tormented his defender before delivering a perfect cross for Deards to cushion a header into the net. Loughborough's first attempt fell to Ben Last but his shot was always rising as it cleared the crossbar. In the 25th minute, Alex Read had the ball in the net for the home side however the linesman's flag was already up for offside. Back came the league leaders and an excellent run and shot by Deards forced a fine save from O'Keefe. Deards should have made it 2-0 a minute later. A precise through ball by Tom Turton was into the path of Deards who was one-on-one with O'Keefe. His shot beat the keeper but was wide of the target. Loughborough were still well in the game and a flick from Joe Boachie played in Read whose shot was well saved by Paul Evans in the Alvechurch goal. Alvechurch doubled their lead in the 39th minute. Edmunds was again the provider, his cross finding March on the edge of the area and his first time shot gave O'Keefe no chance.

With the wind at their backs, much was expected of the Scholars in the second-half but the pressure never materialised. In the 63rd minute, Deards had the first real chance of the half, putting his shot well wide of the post. Alvechurch were indebted to Evans in the 69th minute, the keeper making a fine double save from first Last and then Read. Alvechurch had a decent chance to make it three in the 74th minute when Edmunds played the ball inside to Deards but the shot was off target. With four minutes of normal time remaining, the impressive Souane was narrowly wide with a volley from the left edge of the penalty area. Loughborough missed a great chance to make the closing minutes interesting when Read failed to get a touch on a corner with the goal at his mercy. In stoppage time, an excellent ball from Daniel Dubidat found Turton but his shot was well saved by O'Keefe.

A comfortable afternoon for the league leaders in difficult conditions. They will probably be disappointed not to have won by more but another clean sheet says a lot about their title credentials. On this showing, they will take some stopping.



Review

Premier Division

Leaders **Alvechurch** maintained their 9-point lead following a 2-0 win at **Loughborough University**. First half goals from Connor Deards and Josh March, both getting on the end of crosses from Ryan Edmunds, saw Church home. **Coleshill Town** are the nearest challengers after a last-minute goal from Jordan Nadat settled the game at 3rd placed **Lye Town**. 4th placed **Westfields** are almost certainly out of the promotion equation as they were beaten 2-1 at a resurgent **AFC Wulfrunians**. **Sporting Khalsa** have 6 games in hand on the leaders but they kept up their excellent league form with a 4-2 win at home to **Coventry Sphinx** with Luke Shearer scoring twice. At the bottom, **Tividale** are 11 points adrift of safety after they were beaten 3-0 at home by **Boldmere St Michaels** who move up to 15th. **Brocton** are just two points better off than Tividale and they too face an uphill struggle to avoid the drop after they were beaten 3-1 at Silkmore Lane by 6th placed **St Andrews**. A 2-1 home defeat at the hands of **Long Eaton United** means that **Highgate United** drop into the bottom three. **Stourport Swifts** climbed out of the drop zone with their second win of the week, 3-2 at home to **Rocester**. **Shepshed Dynamo** are 18th as they were beaten by a 4th minute penalty from Kevin Thornton for 8th placed **Coventry United**. **Shawbury United** finished with 9 men as they were beaten 3-0 at home by **Heanor Town** who are 7th. **Quorn** and **Walsall Wood** shared a 1-1 draw which keeps both of them in the 14 team battle to avoid the drop.

Stuart Capaldi bagged the only goal of the game as **Boldmere St Michaels** continued their climb up the table with a 1-0 win at home to **Long Eaton United**.

Bromsgrove Sporting left it late to clinch all 3 points at home to **Heath Hayes**.
