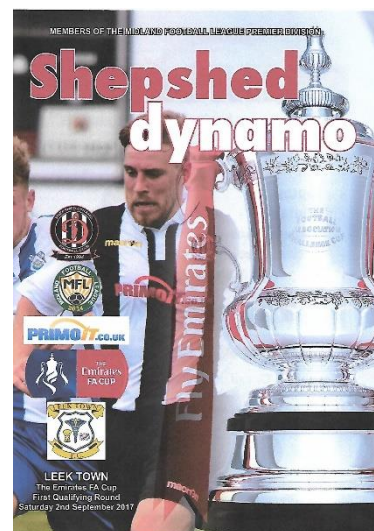
FA Cup 1st Qualifying Round

Shepshed Dynamo 6 Leek Town 1

All of the FA Cup ties involving Midland league sides had the chance to see our sides progress so the decision on where to go was based on the likelihood of a giant killing. Shepshed Dynamo had made an excellent start to the season, winning games and scoring plenty of goals. Visitors Leek Town had made an indifferent start to the season in Northern Premier Division 1 South. On a gloriously sunny day, Dynamo made the perfect start taking the lead in the 4th minute. Karl Whymark delivered the free-kick and skipper Jake Betts powered home a header with the Leek defence stationary. A minute later Whymark had a shot blocked. In the 7th minute Michael Reeve forced an excellent save from Ben Chapman. Shepshed weren't to be denied and they doubled their lead in the 8th minute. An excellent cross from the right by Liam Hurst was met on the volley by new signing Shay Brennan and Chapman had no chance as the ball hit the back of the net. Leek's first foray forward saw Jordan Johnson's shot blocked but it was a brief respite and Shepshed increased their lead in the 17th minute with a sublime piece of skill from Brennan who saw Chapman off his line and executed the perfect lob over his head and into the net. In the 23rd minute, Brennan flashed a shot across the face of goal. In the 27th minute, Brennan was sent clear in the inside left channel, drew Chapman off his line and finished into the bottom corner to make it 4-0. Leek had a chance just after the half hour mark when Tim Grice crossed to the far post and Kyle Blake couldn't reach the ball. Debutant Shepshed keeper Piotr Jacucha made a fine save to thwart Grice as Leek tried to get into the game. Brennan again fired across the face of goal while a cross from Alex Morris evaded Jacucha but dropped wide.

Into the second half, Leek had an opportunity to reduce the deficit but Niall Maguire was off target with his volley from Grice's cross. Shepshed made it 5 in the 55th minute and it owed everything to the close control of Michael Reeve who beat two defenders with the ball at his feet before beating Chapman. Five minutes later and it was 6 as Joe Pheasant powered home a header from a corner from Hurst. Leek pulled a goal back in the 66th minute, Dan Shelley volleying home a corner from Maguire. Shepshed were content to sit on their lead with Leek having plenty of possession with little in the way of end product. Rob Stevenson saw his shot deflected over the bar and Grice had a shot comfortably saved by Jacucha. With seven minutes left, a super move by Leek ended with Johnson volleying over when he really should have hit the target, Shepshed almost scored a 7th with two minutes left when Reeve, played in by Ben Harris, forced a save from Chapman and then put the rebound wide. Leek never looked like making a comeback and Shepshed could celebrate a remarkable victory.

Talk about choosing the right game to go to. A superb performance by Shepshed who took their higher ranked opponents to the cleaners in the first half. Maybe Leek turned up expecting an easy afternoon as at no time did they threaten to upset the home side.



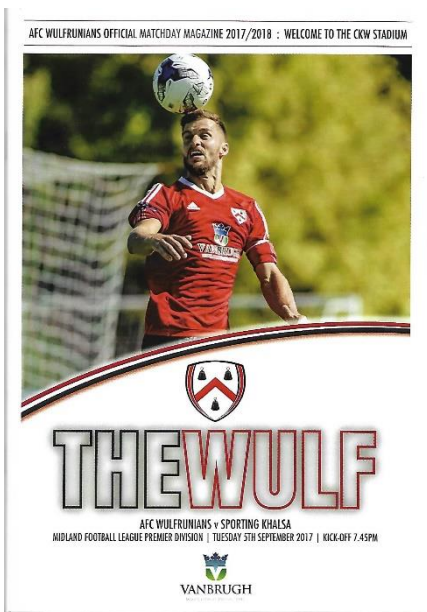

Premier Division

AFC Wulfrunians 2 Sporting Khalsa 4

First visit of the season to the CKW season to witness a local derby between AFC Wulfrunians and Sporting Khalsa which always seems to generate talking points. From October, Khalsa will be ground sharing with Wulfs while their new 3G pitch is installed at the Aspray Arena. Prior to the game, it was the home side that had made the better start to the season with Khalsa languishing in the bottom half of the table. It was clear from the outset that the visitors were 'up' for this one and they took the lead in the 3rd minute. Craig Bannister fired a ball in from the left, Mensah Kinch controlled it well, rounded John Bateman and tapped the ball home. Wulfs first attempt came from Jake Webb whose half-volley cleared the bar in the 9th minute. An excellent right wing cross from Bannister was superbly defended by Andy Broom who knocked the ball away from Marvin Nisbett. In the 13th minute, a horror clearance by Khalsa keeper Tom Turner fooled everyone with no home player able to take the chance. Within a minute, they were ruing their misfortune as Khalsa doubled the lead. A poor headed clearance fell to Jake Holt whose low 25-yard effort flew past Bateman and into the bottom corner. Khalsa were now in complete command and Kinch should have done better when shooting straight at Bateman. Nisbett shot across the face of goal while David Meese was also too accurate with an effort, finding the midriff of the Wulfs keeper. In the 22nd minute, a low free-kick from Holt was well saved by Bateman. Wulfs gradually established a foothold and a cross from Webb was headed wide by Jordan Harrison. Kyle Brady cleared the bar with an effort in the 24th minute. In the 33rd minute, Brady broke clear and his left-foot shot beat Turner to bring Wulfs back into it. A minute later, Brady was close to an equaliser but his shot was too close to Turner who saved. A minute before the break, Khalsa extended their lead. A ball from the left was missed by Tom Ray and Kinch controlled and volleyed past Bateman.

The second half started scrappily. Mike Perks forced a fine save from Bateman who fingertipped his 25-yard effort for a corner. Nisbett wasted a good chance, hitting the side-netting in the 62nd minute. Joe Daley stung the hands of Turner before Khalsa made it 4 in the 67th minute. Nisbett raced clear down the left, unselfishly played the ball into Bannister who picked his spot and gave Bateman no chance. A minute later, Wulfs appealed in vain for a penalty as the ball clearly hit a defender's hand in the penalty area. Perks tried an audacious lob from 40 yards which drifted just wide. In the 82nd minute, Wulfs pulled a goal back when Mitch McDonald's left wing cross was volleyed home in the 6-yard box by Callum Parker. Wulfs continued to push and Richard Palmer was unlucky when his 25-yard effort cannoned off the crossbar. Parker should have grabbed his second when he was allowed a free-header from Ben Jevons' cross but he directed straight at Turner. Deep into stoppage time, McDonald headed wide when well placed summing up Wulfs evening.

Review

FA Cup 1st Qualifying Round

Pride of place in the FA Cup goes to Premier Division **Haughmond** who beat Northern Premier League (Step 3) Matlock Town 3-2 at The Sports Village. Steve Hole gave Haughmond a 2-0 lead inside 15 minutes but the visitors came back to equalise in the second half. Two minutes into stoppage time, Hole completed his hat-trick to make club history for Haughmond. Not to be outdone, Premier Division **Shepshed Dynamo** produced a remarkable performance to beat Northern Premier South Leek Town (Step 4) 6-1 at The Dovecote. Dynamo were 4 up inside 27 minutes with new signing Shay Brennan scoring a superb hat-trick. They then increased their lead to be 6 up on the hour and there was no way back for Leek who were totally outplayed on the day. **Westfields** are in the hat for the next round after a battling goalless draw at Step 4 Soham Town Rangers, the replay at Allpay Park on Wednesday. **Coleshill Town** suffered their first defeat of the season, losing 4-1 at Southern Premier Kings Lynn Town (Step 3). The home side were 4 goals to the good after 22 minutes with Leon Mettam scoring twice. **Hinckley AFC** pushed Northern Premier League Mickleover Sports (Step 3) all the way but a goal from John McGrath sealed a 2-1 victory for Sports. **Brocton** went 3-0 down at home to United Counties League Deeping Rangers (Step 5) but two goals in three minutes gave the Badgers hope. This was extinguished in the last minute as Deeping clinched the game 4-2. Northern Premier South (Step 4) Chasetown took another MFL scalp beating **Boldmere St Michaels** 3-0 at The Trevor Brown Memorial Ground with Muzzy Nduna scoring twice.

Westfields are eyeing up another cup run after beating Soham Town Rangers in a replay at Allpay Park. Alex Hainault got the only goal of the game to set up a 2nd Qualifying round tie with Leamington.

Premier Division

Coventry United take over at the top of the Premier Division maintaining their 100% record with a 2-0 win over **Quorn**. **Heanor Town** slip to 3rd as they were beaten 2-1 at **AFC Wulfrunians**, Craig Gregg with the winner. **Coventry Sphinx** are up to 4th, Ryan Harkin scoring twice in a 3-1 victory over **Sporting Khalsa** at Sphinx Drive. **Bromsgrove Sporting** made it 4 wins out of 5 with a thrilling 4-2 win over **Rocester** at The Victoria Ground. Sean Brain, back at the club, scored twice in the opening 12 minutes for the Rouslers. A goal just before half-time from Alex Dallison gave unbeaten **Lye Town** all three points at home to **Loughborough University**. **Long Eaton United** and **Worcester City** shared the points and four goals at Grange Park with Zak Goodison, for Long Eaton, and Mark Danks, for City, scoring twice. Aaron Lloyd scored twice for **Stourport Swifts** but it wasn't enough as **Rugby Town** ran out 3-2 winners at Butlin Road, Josh Ruff with the all-important goal. A late goal from Jack Tyson gave **South Normanton Athletic** all 3 points in a 2-1 win over **Shawbury United**.

Coventry United dropped their first points of the season as they drew 2-2 with **Rocester** at Butts Park Arena. Coventry were reduced to 10 men when Chris Cox was red carded but the ten men took the lead before Martin Smyth equalised for Rocester from the spot, his second of the game. **Lye Town** are up to 4th following a 1-0 win over FA Cup heroes **Shepshed Dynamo** at Stourbridge Road, Alex Dallison with the goal. Aaron Lloyd scored a hat-trick for **Stourport Swifts** at home to **Haughmond** but doubles from Steve Hole and Joe Parry gave the visitors the points. **Sporting Khalsa** moved into the top half of the table with a 4-2 win at **AFC Wulfrunians**, Mensah Kinch scoring twice. **Quorn** have their first win of the season, a Jacob Croud own goal giving them the points at **Loughborough University**. **Rugby Town** and **Coventry Sphinx** shared the points in a goalless draw at Butlin Road.

A Lei Brown goal just before the hour mark earned **Highgate United** a 1-0 victory at **Shawbury United**.
