Bromsgrove Sporting 1 Coventry United 1

After Bromsgrove Sporting had despatched Sporting Khalsa in the previous round, they had yet another of the MFL leading lights, in the form of Coventry United, to get past if they were to match last season's run to the semi-final. On a damp December day, a crowd in excess of 800, the best of the round, packed into The Victoria Ground to witness a full-blooded cup tie. The home side had the first opportunity when John Pykett forced a fine save from Richard Morris in the 6th minute. From the resulting corner, the ball was flicked on a t the near post and Morris again excelled, turning away the effort. Bromsgrove wasted a good chance in the 9th minute when Pykett's cross was missed by the defender but the ball hit Jason Cowley in front of goal with the striker unable to control the ball. Four minutes later, Cowley went close with an acrobatic bicycle kick from Sean Brain's delivery. Coventry's first opportunity came in the 19th minute when Jak Jeys attempted a scissor kick from Brad jones' cross but it flew over the bar. Morris again saved Coventry in the 23rd minute when Brain's lob forced the keeper into a save at full stretch. Bromsgrove took the lead in the 28th minute. Cowley played a lovely through ball to Pykett, who advanced and passed inside to Cowley. His first shot was well saved by Morris, but the striker reacted guickest and poked home the rebound. Coventry were hanging on and Cowley saw a shot deflected just past the post. Robbie Bunn hit a free-kick against a defender, the ball looping up forcing Morris to tip over. In the 40th minute, Jeys wasted a decent chance for the visitors dragging his shot past the post. In stoppage time, a free-kick from Coventry was headed goalwards by Chris Cox but straight into the arms of Reece Francis.

Bromsgrove started the second half in the same vein as they had played the entire first half. A cross from Bunn was headed over his own bar by Kyle Barnett. Good approach play from Bromsgrove created an opening for Bunn but his effort was off target. In the 51st minute, the home side came close to a second. A shot from Pykett hit Brain, the follow up from Cowley was blocked and then Bunn fired wide from the second rebound. Bromsgrove were to regret missing the chances as Coventry equalised in the 53rd minute. A long ball was played forward and with Francis racing off his line, Jeys got there first to fire the ball into the empty net. In the 59th minute, Pykett played the ball inside to Sam Wills and his first-time effort was wide. Bromsgrove kept up the pressure and a run across the defence by Cowley, created an opening for a shot which Morris saved well. Two minutes later, Cowley set up Brain and Morris made another excellent save. It was Morris against the Bromsgrove forwards and he made the best save of the lot to deny Pykett. In the 77th minute, Mitch Piggon, who had had a quiet afternoon, forced a save from Francis at his near post. Morris was finally beaten in the 85th minute but agonisingly for Bromsgrove, Wills' shot rebounded off the inside of the post. Two minutes later, Aaron Roberts found Cowley at the near post, but he missed the target. There were appeals for a Bromsgrove penalty as Bobby Moseley appeared to handle but nothing was given. In stoppage

time, Lewis Rankin threw himself into the path of a Roberts shot to send the game into extra-time.

The first half was cagey affair but it all changed in the final quarter of an hor. In the 107th minute, Coventry substitute Rob Prinzel was shown a straight red card for a foot-up challenge. Two minutes later, Connor Deards found Cowley but he couldn't keep his shot down. In the 111th minute, Bromsgrove were awarded a penalty when Cowley was tripped in the area. Up stepped captain Wills who blasted the spot-kick wide. Five minutes from time, a Roberts cross found Cowley unmarked, but he headed over and the game goes to a replay.

Walsall Senior Cup Round 1

Stafford Rangers 3 Boldmere St Michaels 1

Second consecutive Tuesday evening as Stafford Rangers face Premier Division opposition in Boldmere St Michaels. Evostik Premier Division Rangers fielded a strong side as they looked to find their scoring boots after a run of disappointing results. The Mikes have been in the bottom three of the Premier Division for most of the season and a good result here would boost morale with important league games to come. As expected, the home side started on the front foot and Reiss Wagstaff was forced to make a decent save from Dan Westwood in the 2nd minute. Massiah McDonald was off target for Rangers in the 8th minute but the home side took the lead a minute later. A ball from the right from Kai Davis found Osebi Abadaki and he slotted home. Jack Sherratt went close to doubling Rangers lead, his shot on the turn just over the bar. Good approach play from Rangers gave Sherratt another chance but his finish was poor. Abadaki was causing problems with his pace and he set up McDonald who blasted way over. Rangers' finishing didn't improve and Sherratt hit a shot out of the ground when he really should have done better. In the 33rd minute, Sherratt finally hit the target but Wagstaff made a comfortable save. In the 35th minute, an excellent run by Abadaki saw him cross to the far post and McDonald put his effort wide. The Mikes first attempt came in the 37th minute when Cameron Gayle was off target with a shot. Westwood went close for Rangers, controlling the ball well and then curling a shot off the outside of the post. Very much against the run of play, The Mikes equalised a minute before the break. Ben Usher-Shipway shot on the turn giving Adam Whitehouse no chance.

Five minutes into the second half, Rangers thought they had retaken the lead when Alex Fletcher's shot looked a goal all the way but Wagstaff pulled off a fantastic save. Two minutes later, Fletcher was not to be denied as he put the ball into the far corner from the edge of the area. Wagstaff again saved well on the hour mark to thwart Sherratt. Seconds later Abadaki was fouled in the area by Danal Hallissey but the referee awarded a corner much to the disgust of the home side, From the corner, Jordaan Brown rose highest and his goalbound effort was expertly saved again by Wagstaff. The Mikes should have pulled a goal back in the 66th minute when Ryan Nesbitt was picked out by Usher-Shipway, but his shot was too close to Whitehouse who saved well. In the 72nd minute, last-ditch defending by The Mikes kept out efforts from Kieran Morris and McDonald. A minute later, McDonald latched onto Westwood's flick on and hammered the ball past Wagstaff to give Rangers a two-goal cushion. Sherratt had the ball in the net in the 78th minute but it was chalked off with Westwood in an offside position. Two minutes into time added on, Wagstaff's clearance found Abadaki, and with the keeper out of his goal, the winger shot from 40 yards, but it drifted just wide.

Review

Buildbase FA Vase Round 3

The MFL will have five teams in the 4th round of this season's FA Vase. Last season's semi-finalists **Coleshill Town** are on the march again following a fine 2-1 win at **Highgate United**. Dean Rathbone was the hero for the Colemen scoring twice with the winner coming in stoppage time. **Hinckley AFC** reached the fourth round for the second successive season as they knocked out higher ranked Deeping Rangers 3-1 at St Johns Park. **Westfields** travelled to Devon for the second round in succession and left it very late to beat Plymouth Parkway. The home side were leading into time added on but first Craig Jones and then Jamie Molyneux, in the 95th minute, scored to send Fields through 3-2. **Racing Club Warwick** bowed out of the competition, two second half goals for Wisbech Town sending the Fenmen through. A Nick MacPherson hat-trick helped **Stourport Swifts** to a 3-1 win over Division 1 promotion hopefuls **Walsall Wood** at Walshes Meadow. **Shepshed Dynamo** travelled to West Midlands Regional League leaders Wolverhampton Sporting Community and suffered a 5-0 defeat with Kyle Delaney scoring a hat-trick for the home side. **Bromsgrove Sporting** and **Coventry United** went head to head at The Victoria Ground and they could not be separated after 120 minutes. Sporting dominated the game but found United keeper Rich Morris in outstanding form. In extra-time Rob Prinzel saw red for United and Sam Wills missed a penalty for Sporting as the game went to a replay at The Butts Park Arena.

A remarkable replay at The Butts Park Arena saw **Bromsgrove Sporting** race into a 3-0 lead, a scoreline they held into the 79th minute. Back came **Coventry United** to draw level 5 minutes into injury time. After 4 hours of football, the tie went to penalties. The first 6 penalties were scored but this was followed by 5 unconverted spotkicks. Max Loveridge scored from the spot to send Bromsgrove through,

Preview
