Review

Premier Division

Three games into the season and only **Sporting Khalsa** have a 100% record. They beat **Coventry Sphinx** 5-0 at The Aspray Arena with Dan Westwood scoring three. Division 1 champions **Heather St Johns** are 2nd following a 4-0 win over **Racing Club Warwick** at St Johns Park, Malachi Farquharson with a double. **Walsall Wood** are 3rd as they twice came from behind to beat **Haughmond** 3-2 at Oak Park. **Newark Flowserve** continue their fine start to life at Step 5 with a 2-1 win at **Highgate united**, Kyle Dixon with the winner. Richard Hanslow scored twice for **South Normanton Athletic** who won 4-2 at **Romulus**. There was a remarkable game at the CKW Stadium as **AFC Wulfrunians** beat **Long Eaton united** 6-4. David Kolodynski scored three for the visitors but Angelo Franco scored twice and Jumaane Meggoe scored an impressive hat-trick for Wulfs who got off the mark. **Boldmere St Michaels** are still searching for their first point of the season as they went down 3-0 at **Worcester City**, Luke English scoring twice. **Gresley** are also searching for their first point as they were beaten 3-1 at The Moat Ground by **Tividale** for whom Darragh Bustin scored twice. **Selston** have their first points as an MFL club as they edged out **Lye Town** 3-2 at The MJ Robinson Arena. **Stourport Swifts** came from behind to beat **Coventry United** 3-1 at Walshes Meadow with all 3 Swifts goals in the last 20 minutes.

Heather St Johns went top of the table on Monday evening following a 2-1 win at **Boldmere St Michaels** who remain pointless. Kieron Clarke scored both goals in the second half as heather came from behind to win.

Last year's runners-up **Walsall Wood** are up to 2nd following a 1-0 win at **Highgate United**. Wood left it late with Cameron Lee getting the goal 5 minutes from time. **Newark Flowserve** are level on points in 3rd and they left it even later to beat **Gresley** at Lowfields with Jack Beckett scoring in stoppage time in their 1-0 win. **South Normanton Athletic** are up to 4th as they beat former leaders **Sporting Khalsa** 3-1, Martin Smyth with a brace. Preview

FA Cup Preliminary Round

Mickleover Sports (NP) vs **Coventry Sphinx** (MFLP)

The FA Cup weekend starts on Friday evening. Sphinx make the tough journey to the Don Amot Arena to face Northern Premier Division Mickleover Sports. Mickleover started the season with a solid 1-0 win over Stalybridge Celtic before losing 1-0 at Witton Albion in midweek. Sphinx beat local rivals Coventry United in the last round but will do well to take this to a replay.

AFC Wulfrunians (MFLP) vs Leek Town (NPSE)

Wulfs host Northern Premier South East Leek Town with Leek one of the favourites for promotion this season. They began with a good away win at Wisbech Town and followed that with a home win over Kidsgrove Athletic. Wulfs have started slowly in the league but a 6-4 win at home last Saturday kick started their season. Leek's last trip to an MFL side ended in a thumping at Shepshed Dynamo. A replay at Harrison park would be a good result for Wulfs.

Belper Town (NPSE) vs **Sporting Khalsa (MFLP)**

MFL pacesetters Khalsa travel to the Raygar Stadium to face Northern Premier South East Belper Town. The Nailers began with a 4-3 win at Market Drayton Ton with dangerous striker Zeph Thomas on the scoresheet and followed that up with a 3-1 win over Frickley Athletic. . Khalsa have started the season in sparking form with hot shot Dan Westwood, banging in the goals. A replay at The Aspray Arena would be no surprise.

Bromsgrove Sporting (SPC) vs **Leicester Road (MFL1)**

Promises to be the biggest crowd of the round as former MFL champions Bromsgrove Sporting welcome Leicester Road to the Victoria Ground. The Rouslers have gone from strength to strength since winning the MFL and have a squad good enough to challenge for promotion to the National League North. Leicester Road have started brilliantly with a 100% record to date. They have enough firepower to cause the home side problems.

Gresley (MFLP) vs Sutton Coldfield Town (NPSE)

Gresley welcome Sutton Coldfield to The Moat Ground needing a good win to get their season started. Sutton lost at home to Spalding on Saturday and were beaten by Carlton on Wednesday. Gresley took their place in this round after Dunkirk were thrown out of the competition by the FA, prior to the replay taking place. Sutton will start as favourites but this is a great chance for Gresley to make some headway.

Heather St Johns (MFLP) vs **Worcester City (MFLP)**

A great call by the BBC who have decided to live stream this cup tie at St Johns Park on their website and across social media. Both teams beat Step 6 opposition in the previous round and have made decent starts to their league campaign. Heather sit top of the MFL going into the game while Worcester suffered a heavy defeat in midweek. Expect this to be a tight contest which could easily go to a replay

Lichfield City (MFL1) vs Haughmond (MFLP)

An intriguing tie between Division 1 leaders Lichfield and WMRL runners up Haughmond. Both sides had excellent results in the previous round beating Highgate United and Walsall Wood respectively. Lichfield have a habit of scoring lots of goals at home and the challenge for The Mond will be to match them.

Long Eaton United (MFLP) vs South Normanton Athletic (MFLP)

Two sides that went goal crazy in the previous round and they sit in the top 6 of the Premier Division after excellent midweek victories. Could easily be a high scoring game and both sides will feel as though they have strong chances to reach the 1st Qualifying Round.

Romulus (MFLP) vs Market Drayton Town (NPSE)

Romulus needed extra time in a replay to beat Wolverhampton Casuals in the previous round but will go into the game with confidence after a good cup run last season. Market Drayton have lost both of their league games and won't be relishing the trip to Castle Vale Stadium. A giant killing would could be on the cards.

Stourport Swifts (MFLP) vs Boldmere St Michaels (MFLP)

Swifts had an excellent win at Atherstone Town in the previous round while the Mikes beat higher ranked Daventry Town. Swifts have started much the better in the league and would be confident of progress with home advantage.
