The New Manor Ground played host to a number of junior football matches before **Ilkeston Town** faced Racing Club Warwick.

Across three pitches, the fans were given a glimpse of what the future holds for Ilkeston football club, with Ilkeston Barca under 8s, Ilkeston Real under 8s, Ilkeston Albion under 10s and Ilkeston Vipers under 10s all in action.

Both Ilkeston Barca and Real tested themselves and stepped up in age group to face Racing Club Warwick's under 9s side. While Real played a small practice game, Barca lost 2-0 in their first match. But at the second time of asking they got the win. Harley Wood scoring the winner in a 1-0 victory.

Ilkeston Real picked up a win and a draw from their two games against the visitors. Harry Smith score as they ran out 1-0 winners in the first game before a goalless draw in their second game.

All three sides involved enjoyed their time on the pitch and Racing Club Warwick's under 9s coach Gareth Standford was grateful for the opportunity, saying "Thank you to Ilkeston Town for the invite, it has been a great opportunity for the kids at both clubs".

It was an all Ilkeston affair in the under 10s as Ilkeston Vipers faced off against Ilkeston Albion. Both sets of managers were thankful for the opportunity given to their players. Vipers manager Luke Brown said "it's been great for the players, getting to play and experience a proper stadium". This view was echoed by Albion manager Wayne Fisher, who said that "it was good for the players, they've had fun being able to play in front of a crowd".

The Aston Villa Foundation has announced the launch of a new Girls Football Academy.

The Academy will form an integral part of the Aston Villa Ladies' new player pathway when it launches in line with the next academic year.

In partnership with BMet, the Academy – which is targeted at current year 11 pupils – will offer students the freedom to study any A Levels, BTEC or vocational course on offer at the college while representing Aston Villa in the National Football Youth League.

The Girls Football Academy will also provide players with the realistic prospect of progressing into the senior set-up of Aston Villa Ladies, who currently play in Women's Super League Two.

Manager of Foundation and Community Partnerships, Andy Taylor said: "The programme offers an opportunity for young aspiring footballers to study full-time whilst representing Aston Villa on a weekly basis. "This programme allows players to continue playing for other clubs at the weekend whilst learning in the Aston Villa environment during the week. It also provides a realistic opportunity for a player to progress into our WSL team."

The Academy will play their home matches at **Boldmere St Michael's FC**, which will also become the Aston Villa Ladies' new home ground for the 2018/19 season.

Jason Allen, Sport and Sports Academy Manager at BMet, feels the new partnership presents an excellent option for budding footballers who also want to commit to their studies.

He said: "This is a fantastic opportunity for the largest Midlands club to work with the largest further education college in the region to deliver an excellent football and education pathway programme. "BMet offers the widest range of programmes for the student as well as many support areas that will ensure a dedicated football scholar can be successful in their chosen academic or vocational pathway."

At its board meeting earlier this week, **Bromsgrove Sporting Football Club** decided to cease having a Reserve team at the end of this season. In previous seasons, the Reserves had played in the Midland Football League Under 21s division.

The decision was made purely on footballing reasons. Reserve teams usually allow first team players to recover from or from injury as well as getting match time when they were not playing. In addition, the teams normally allow young players to progress to playing for the first team.

Although there had been some successes, it was decided to look for an alternative method of allowing first team players to get practice and match time and as a method of allowing young players to gain experience and preparation for first team football.

Any footballers playing for the under-18s team showing potential could then be loaned to any “feeder” club or clubs whereby gaining experience.

Bromsgrove Sporting will be seeking agreements with local clubs who run teams with whom dual registration will be possible allowing player exchanges between clubs as and when required.

The decision to cease the Reserve side was not taken lightly and the board of directors wish to thank everybody involved with the team in particular Dave Smith the manager, his coaches and the players who have shown considerable loyalty to the Club along with Andy Parr, the Reserves match secretary.

Review

Premier Division

Worcester City ramped up the pressure on the top two with a 5-0 win over **Long Eaton United** at The Victoria ground. All the goals came in the first half with James Baldwin and Dave Reynolds both scoring twice. **Stourport Swifts** grabbed a point at home to **Rugby Town**, Matt Fulloway making it 1-1 in the 89th minute. **South Normanton Athletic** moved out of the bottom three and are replaced by visitors **Haughmond** as the two goals from Kieran O'Connell gave the Shiners the points.

Coleshill Town maintained their two-point lead at the top of the table with a 4-0 win at Pack Meadow over **AFC Wulfrunians**. **Bromsgrove Sporting** bounced back from their midweek defeat at the hands of Coleshill to beat **Sporting Khalsa** 1-0 at CKW Stadium, Jason Cowley with the goal. 3rd placed **Worcester City** were held to a goalless draw at The Victoria Ground by **Boldmere St Michaels** and they now have an 8-point gap to close on the top two. **Highgate United** are up to 4th and, with games in hand, are genuine promotion contenders. They beat **Loughborough University** 2-0 at The Coppice with both goals inside the first 22 minutes. At the foot of the table, **Rocester** are 11 points adrift of safety following a 3-1 defeat at Hillsfield at the hands of **Long Eaton United**. 2nd bottom **Shawbury United** were beaten 2-1 at **Quorn** and they are 4 points adrift of safety but with a superior goal difference. **Haughmond** moved out of the bottom three on goal difference following a 1-1 draw with **Shepshed Dynamo** at the Sports village. **South Normanton Athletic** drop back into the relegation zone as they were beaten 5-2 at **Lye Town** with Adam Meacham scoring twice for The Flyers. **Westfields** made it three wins in a week with Craig Jones scoring both goals in their 2-1 victory at **Rugby Town**. Shaquille McDonald scored twice for a resurgent **Coventry United** in a 3-0 win at The Butts Park Arena over **Stourport Swifts**. Two goals inside the opening half-hour was enough for **Heanor Town** at home to **Coventry Sphinx**, 2-0 the final score.

Bromsgrove Sporting return to the top of the division with an emphatic 6-0 win over lowly **Loughborough University**. Richard Gregory and Jason Cowley both scored twice for The Rouslers. Two second half goals earned **Highgate United** all 3 points in their top of the table clash with **Coleshill Town** at The Coppice. 5th and 6th placed **Sporting Khalsa** and **Coventry Sphinx** couldn't find a goal between them at the CKW Stadium. **Long Eaton United** are up to 7th, Will Mellors-Blair scoring twice in a 3-2 win at **Stourport Swifts**. **Heanor Town** are a place further back following a 2-0 win over relegation threatened **Haughmond** at The Town Ground. **Shepshed Dynamo** came from behind to beat **Lye Town** 3-1 at The Dovecote.

South Normanton Athletic's relegation worries deepened as they were beaten 3-0 at home by a resurgent **Coventry United**. A Liam Taylor goal in the 8th minute boosted **Shawbury United's** prospects of avoiding relegation with a 1-0 win over **Rugby Town**. Shawbury are now just a point behind both South Normanton Athletic and Haughmond. An equaliser from Martin Smyth gave bottom club **Rocester** a vital point in a 1-1 draw at **Westfields**.

Hinckley AFC continued their goal scoring exploits with a 3-0 win over **Cadbury Athletic**, Steve Hart scoring twice. A solitary Paul Sullivan goal was enough for leaders **Walsall Wood** to stretch the lead at the top of the table to 7 points with two games in hand as they beat **Littleton** 1-0 at 5 Acres. **Coventry Copsewood** left it late to grab a point at home to **Paget Rangers**, equalising in the final minute in a 1-1 draw. **Racing Club Warwick** moved to within 8 points of second with a 2-1 win at 3rd placed **Leicester Road**.

There is only one place to start in reviewing last Saturday and that is at The New Manor Ground where a phenomenal gate of 1,889 turned up to watch 2nd placed **Ilkeston Town** take on 6th placed **Racing Club Warwick**. The game matched the occasion with the Robins taking a 3-0 lead, Alex Marshall scoring twice before a late comeback from The Racers brought it back to 3-2. Two goals from Tony Clarke gave **Walsall Wood** all 3 points at home to **Brocton** who remain 6 points clear of relegation. **Atherstone Town** remain 4th following a 2-0 win over **Coventry Copsewood** at The Mark Webster Community Stadium. **Hinckley AFC** had to come from 2-0 down to beat **Pershore Town** 3-2 at St Johns Park, James Williams scoring twice. At the foot of the table, **Stafford Town** stay 2nd bottom following a 3-1 home defeat at the hands of **Lichfield City** with former Town man, Tom Green scoring twice. **Bolehall Swifts** are a point ahead of Stafford as they suffered a 3-0 defeat at **Paget Rangers**. **Nuneaton Griff** continued their recent good run with a 3-1 win at **Studley**, Lewis Commins scoring twice. **Heath Hayes** picked up an excellent 3 points at **Littleton** to move them up to 13th in the table. **Cadbury Athletic** and **Uttoxeter Town** battled out a 1-1 draw at The TSA with Town missing a penalty which would have given them three wins in the week.

On Monday, **Paget Rangers** climbed to 8th in the table following a 2-1 win at home to **Studley**, Ross Dempster with both the goals. **Brocton** moved 9 points away from the drop zone with a 2-1 win at **Chelmsley Town**.

Atherstone Town moved to within two points of second place with a 6-1 home win over Brocton. Alex Naughton scored twice to move to 38 goals for the season.
