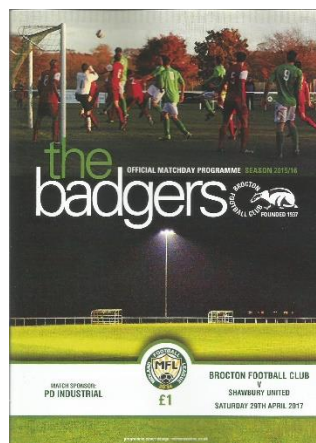

Brocton 1 Shawbury United 3

The final day of the season in the Premier Division saw three teams in a battle to avoid relegation. Shawbury United travelled to already relegated Brocton needing a win to give themselves any hope. Brocton had conceded 5 or more goals in their last three games but wanted to leave the Premier Division with a positive result. It was the home side that started the better. Joe Hartshorne forced a save from Nick Ashley in the 2nd minute. Dan Lomas then saw a header cleared off the line as the home side looked to upset all the pre-game permutations. Shawbury's first attempt came from Stuart Ellis but Aidan Stone made a comfortable save. Shawbury took the lead in the 10th minute when a cross from the left fell at the feet of Ellis who hammered the ball past Stone. The lead was doubled 5 minutes later with Ben Osei finishing clinically following a Liam Brant break. The game should have neem over in the 18th minute. A driving run from the half way line from Kevin Buxton was halted by Stone and as the ball fell to Josh Thomas, Stone was there again to block the rebound. Brocton had a half-chance in the 22nd minute, Kenny Devoir firing over the bar. Shawbury were looking a real threat going forward with the pace of Osei and the strength of Ellis. Osei broke away from the Badgers defence but his pass to Ellis was intercepted. Ellis then saw a shot blocked by Devoir putting his body in the way of a fierce shot. An excellent run by Jack Edwards saw his shot blocked by James Askey. Osei then created an opportunity for Buxton but his effort was easily saved by Stone. Brocton pulled a goal back in the 40th minute. A free-kick from Matt Hardiman was headed back into the area by Lomas where Brocton's record scorer Gary Fife was on hand to finish from 6 yards. There were appeals by the visitors for a penalty when Thomas went down in the area but quite rightly, the referee waved away the protests. In stoppage time, Ellis found space and curled a superb shot over the angle of post and bar.

Shawbury started the second half well with Adam Groom creating space for himself, seeing his shot well saved by Stone. Brocton were close to an equaliser a minute later when Lomas headed a Hardiman corner onto the cross bar. Brocton were causing Shawbury problems and a direct run from Edwards saw him hit the target but Ashley made an excellent save. The game was end to end but interspersed with niggly fouls which began to test the patience of the referee. Shawbury were awarded a free-kick just outside the area when Ellis was adjudged to have been fouled. Ellis was off target with his effort. Brocton were reduced to 10 men in the 66th minute when Matt Dockerty was shown a straight red card for a shocking challenge which gave the referee no option. To compound matters for the home side, Shawbury increased their lead two minutes later. A cross from Liam Armstrong was headed powerfully into the net by Adam Groom giving Stone no chance. A challenge by Fife on Osei in the penalty area could easily have seen a spot kick but the officials were happy that he won the ball fairly. In the 83rd minute, Buxton decided to shoot when Ellis was in acres of space. Osei forced another save from Stone after Ellis had set him up. In stoppage time, a fantastic run by Hardiman from inside his own half, saw him win a corner. Four minutes into stoppage time, Ashley saved well from Dave Ablewhite but it was not to be for the 10-men as Shawbury celebrated staying up once confirmation was received that Walsall Wood had been defeated.

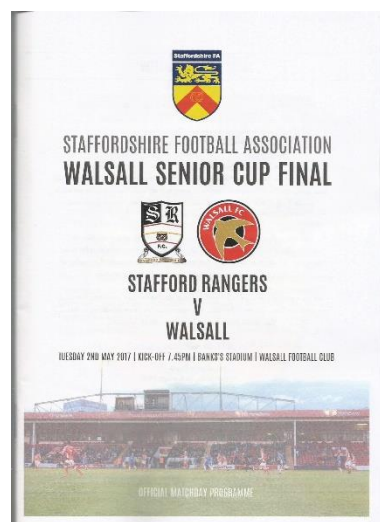
Walsall Senior Cup Final (73)

Walsall 3 Stafford Rangers 1

One of the highlights of the County Cup competitions is the Walsall Senior Cup Final which is hosted by Walsall FC at The Banks's Stadium. Traditionally a night for local non-league clubs to put on a show at an EFL ground with the potential for some end of season silverware. The final tonight pits the youngsters from the host club against Northern Premier League Stafford Rangers. The home side started much the better with Milan Butterfield trying a shot from distance which cleared Adam Whitehouse's cross bar. Rangers first attempt came courtesy of Kyle Perry who controlled the ball on his chest and volleyed over the bar. In the 9th minute, Whitehouse made a fine save keeping out a header from Butterfield. A mistake by Rangers midfielder Mitchell Tolley let in Amadou Bakayoko but Whitehouse was equal to the chip and made another decent save. Rangers wasted a glorious opportunity in the 20th minute. A cross from Tyler Little from the right was perfectly into the path of Ben Haseley, the Rangers front man completely missing his kick in front of goal. A minute later and Rangers should have been ahead. Perry flicked the ball on to the onrushing Izak Reid but keeper Brandon Ganley came off his line to block the effort. Ganley was forced into another save when Walsall failed to deal with a James Bowen long throw, and the keeper had to punch away a goalbound header from Matt Bailey. Walsall responded and Whitehouse saved well at his near post from Tobias Hayles-Docherty. Walsall took the lead in the 35th minute with a well worked goal. Maz Kouyhar and Bakoyoko combined to set up Butterfield who rolled the ball into the bottom corner. As half-time approached, Perry was just off target with a volley and Reid curled a shot inches over the bar from the left edge of the penalty area.

Walsall were fast out of the blocks in the second half and an excellent run by Sangha ended with a shot off target. The home side doubled their lead in the 50th minute. A low ball was played in from the right and Hayles-Docherty's first time shot was too good for Whitehouse. Walsall had one hand on the trophy in the 57th minute as they made it three. A free-kick from Sangha was swept home by Bakoyoko. Rangers were close to pulling a goal back within a minute when Perry headed over Ganley but Kory Roberts made a fine clearance. Hayles-Docherty forced another fine save from Whitehouse but three substitution by the non-league side gave them the edge as they worked hard to get back into the game. Kris Taylor saw his shot blocked by the impressive Butterfield. A cross from Taylor was deflected past his own post by Liam Kinsella. From the corner taken by Richard Bachelor, Perry headed wide. Rangers pulled a goal back in the 73rd minute, Perry heading home an excellent cross from Bowen. The goal gave Rangers hope and Izak Reid just failed to connect with a spectacular overhead from a Lyttle cross. Perry was again off target with a header, planting Taylor's free-kick over the bar. With 5 minutes remaining, Perry had a great chance to make it 3-2 but he snatched at his shot and it drifted wide. Into stoppage time, and the theme continued with Perry heading wide and Taylor also off target following a Perry knock down. With the final attempt of the game, Jake Heath must have thought he had scored but Walsall skipper Roberts made a fine block on the line.

An excellent cup final with plenty of action to keep everyone involved. The quality of the full-time youngsters was probably the edge over the 90 minutes while Stafford will rue the number of missed chances.

JW Hunt Cup Semi Final (74)

Alvechurch 2 Sporting Khalsa 1 (at AFC Wulfrunians)

Two teams and two managers that know each other well meet with a Molineux final the trophy for the winner. Sporting Khalsa are the holders after beating Wolverhampton Sporting Community in last year's competition. Alvechurch are still on for the treble of league, league cup and JW Hunt Cup. The Church side was much changed from that which celebrated their league title on Saturday while Khalsa were not far from full strength. David Meese was the first to have an attempt on goal, his 2nd minute header landing on the roof of the net. Meese had a further attempt in the 11th minute, firing over the bar. An excellent run by Callum Baker for Alvechurch saw the youngster beat a number of defenders before shooting wide. Khalsa took the lead in the 17th minute. A low cross from Mensah Kinch was sidefooted home by Marvin Nisbett with the Church defence nowhere. Mike Perks looped a header onto the roof of the net from a Jonny Haynes corner. At the other end, a mistake by Tes Robinson let in Josh McKenzie but his finish was well wide.

The second half began with Khalsa in the ascendancy. An excellent challenge by Babucar Souane foiled Nisbett. From the corner. Lewis Gwilliams rushed off his line and made a complete hash of the catch, luckily for him the ball dropping wide. In the 50th minute, a corner from Craig Bannister picked out Meese in space but his header was over the bar. Three minutes later, the woodwork came to Church' rescue as Meese' header hit the outside of the post. At this stage, it was all Khalsa and when a Meese header was blocked, Fabrice Kasiama was bundled over in the area with the officials deciding there was no infringement. A free-kick from Karl Edwards picked out McKenzie who managed to head the ball away from the goal rather than toward it. In the 62nd minute, Edwards appeared to be fouled in the area, the decision going somewhat surprisingly to Khalsa. Alvechurch were now on the attack and Tom Turner made an excellent save to thwart Jack Cresswell, his header going to the keeper's right. A cross from Souane picked out Josh March at the far post but his shot hit the sidenetting. The equaliser arrived in the 77th minute when McKenzie picked his spot and shot underneath Turner. Turner made another excellent save, with Souane's shot destined to find the top corner. Into stoppage time, Andy Parsons had a shot saved by Turner while Simeon Townsend was off target with a fine effort for Khalsa.

Extra time was feisty with both sides not giving any quarter. In the 96th minute, Meese had an effort saved by Gwilliams. Into the second period of extra-time, a shot by Ryan Edmunds bought out the best save of the night from Turner. Good work by Yusifu Ceesay created an opening but his shot flew agonisingly wide. With two minutes of extra time remaining, Reece Shilvock found space and from 25 yards hit on unstoppable shot into the top corner to send Church threw to the JW Hint Cup Final.

Review

Premier Division

All eyes were on the battle to avoid relegation with three teams in the equation on the last day of the season. **Shawbury United** had to win to give themselves any chance and they did just that, 3-1 away at relegated **Brocton**. Two goals inside the first 15 minutes sent them on their way and they were helped when Brocton were reduced to 10 men in the second half. **AFC Wulfrunians** needed a point to stay up and they improved on that with a fine 2-1 win at high-flying **Heanor Town**. The Lions took the lead but two goals in quick succession around the half hour mark gave Wulfs all three points. This left **Walsall Wood** needing a point at **Westfields** but it was the FA Cup heroes who ran out 4-0 winners with Aiden Thomas grabbing a hat-trick. The result means the Wood finish below Shawbury on goal difference. At the top of the table. Champions **Alvechurch** finished their season with a 3-0 win over **Rocester** with Daniel Dubidat scoring twice. The teams in 2nd and 3rd shared the points in a 6-goal thriller at Pack Meadow. **Coleshill Town** twice held the lead against **Sporting Khalsa** but two goals from Tony Clarke meant honours were even. 4th placed **Lye Town** finished with a 1-0 win over **Loughborough University** thanks to a Jack Till goal in the 70th minute. **Highgate United's** fine end to the season sees them finish in 7th place, recording a 4-1 win over **Coventry Sphinx** despite being reduced to 9 men. **Boldmere St Michaels** beat **Coventry United** 4-3 at The Trevor Brown Memorial Ground. Joe Lyng scored three for the Mikes with Kai Williams bagging a brace for Coventry. **Shepshed Dynamo** and **Quorn** shared 6 goals at The Dovecote, Michael Reeve scoring twice for Dynamo. **Stourport Swifts** and **St Andrews** shared the points at Walshes Meadow, 2-2 the final score. **Tividale** bowed out of the MFL with a 4-2 home defeat at the hands of **Long Eaton United** who finish 14th. Andy Todd scored twice for the visitors.
